

DESIGN FOR A TOY MONEY-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 21,457, dated April 12, 1892.

Application filed March 17, 1892. Serial No. 425,357. Term of patent 7 years.

all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DANIEL COOKE, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Camden, Camden county, New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for a Toy Money-Bank, of which the following is a specification.

My design for a toy money-bank is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, to which represents the bank in elevation.

The main feature of the design is the representation of an elephant and a clown. The elephant is represented as seated on a chair in front of a table and having a bib tied around his neck. One fore foot of the elephant is extended and the trunk is curved and the mouth open. On the opposite side of the table is the representation of a clown

sitting on a stool holding in one hand a cup and in the other hand a saucer within the 20 reach of the elephant's extended fore foot. A bucket is represented as situated directly below the saucer. The whole is mounted upon a base.

I claim-

The within-described design for a toy money-bank, as fully described, and illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
