

## DESIGN FOR A MONEY-BOX.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 35,119, dated September 17, 1901.

Application filed August 24, 1901. Serial No. 73,211. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES A. BAILEY, of Cromwell, in the county of Middlesex, State of Connecticut, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Money-Box, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The leading features of my design for a money-box are, first, the representation of a man holding in the arms thereof the representation of a hat; next, a table in front of the man and below the hat, and, finally, a base of step form on which the representation of the man and table are placed.

The figure represents a perspective view of

a money-box embodying my design.

In the drawing, A designates the representation of a man, whose arms B are out20 stretched.

C designates the represention of a hatheld by said arms.

D designates a table, which is located in front of the representation of a man and below the representation of a hat.

E designates a stand or base on which the representation of a man and table are placed, said stand or base being of step form, as at F.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters 30 Patent, is—

The design for a money-box substantially as shown and described.
